



Purpose


To present an overview of the Office of the Secretary of Defense's Special Access Program Coordination Office organization and process for acquisition oversight.



What are SAPs?

As authorized by E.O. 12958, any program which imposes "need-to-know" and other enhanced security measures <u>beyond those</u> normally required for access to collateral information.

- Why do we have SAPs?
 - Protect significant U.S. Operational and Technological breakthroughs
 - Protect our Exploitation of Adversary Vulnerabilities
 - Reduce Intelligence on U.S. Force Capabilities
 - Protect Sensitive Operational Plans







SAP CATEGORIES

- ** ACQUISITION Established primarily for the protection of sensitive RDT&E, or procurement activities in support of sensitive military and intelligence requirements.
- **OPERATIONS & SUPPORT** Established primarily for the protection of the planning and execution of sensitive military operations, or to provide sensitive support to non-DoD agencies.
- INTELLIGENCE Established primarily for the protection of the planning and execution of sensitive intelligence or counter-intelligence operations, the intelligence collected or the exploitation of that intelligence.





Acquisition Oversight

 - © CJCSM 3170.01E, Joint Capabilities Integration and Development System
 - SAP Programs follow the same acquisition oversight as all other DoD programs.
- Procurement
 - Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR)
 - Defense Federal Acquisition Regulation Supplement (DFARS)

Re-occurring Management Controls

- Annual Program Listing to Congress (10 U.S.C. § 119, 1 February)
- Annual Report to Congress (10 U.S.C. § 119, 1 March)
- * Biannual Program Objective Memorandum (POM)
- Biannual Program Change Proposal/Budget Change Proposal (PCP/BCP)
- Annual Program Budget Reviews
- ** SRG Reviews and makes recommendation all program changes, restructures, and terminations as necessary
- SAPOC approves all program changes, restructures and terminations

Acquisition Oversight (continued)

- Annual Acquisition Oversight Initiative (AOI) report to the Under Secretary of Defense (Acquisition, Technology, & Logistics)
- Quarterly AOI Integrated Process Team (IPT) reviews of designated AOI Programs
- Audits as required by
 - GAO
 - P DoD IG
- © Contract Management Review & Oversight
 - P DCMA.
 - P DCAA

UNCLASSIFIED CITICE OF THE CONGRESSIONAL REPORTING

- © Covered under Title 10, U.S.C. § 119
- SAP reporting requirements to Congress:
 - Annual Report due 1 March each year
 - Additional requirements for establishing, terminating, and any significant change in classification
- SECDEF may WAIVE Congressional reporting if inclusion would adversely affect National Security
- If SECDEF, in his oversight functions, exercises WAIVER authority, SAP information, and justification for Waiver, will be provided to the Chairmen and Ranking Minority Members of the Defense Committees
- New Start Reporting/Authority
