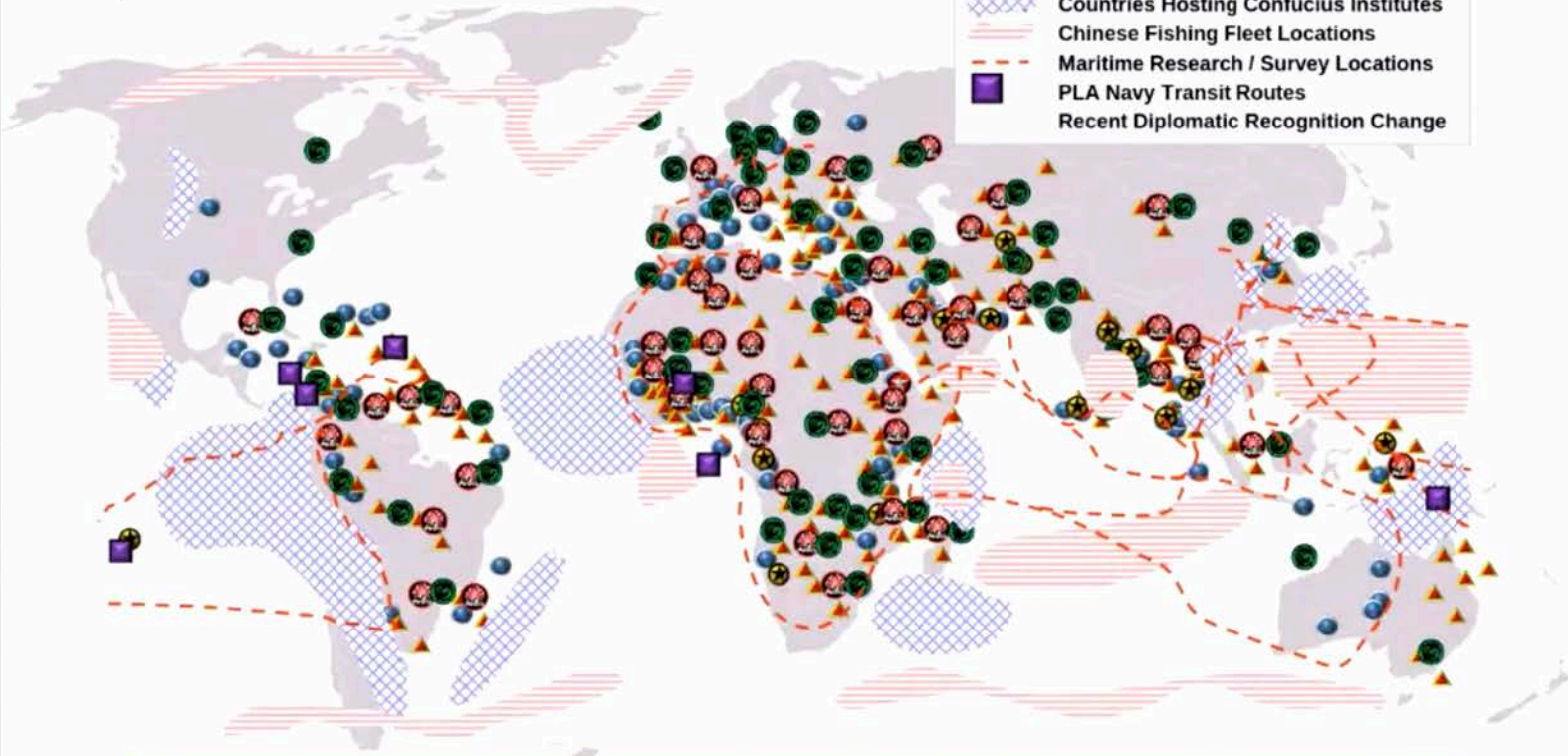


# China Global Influence Map

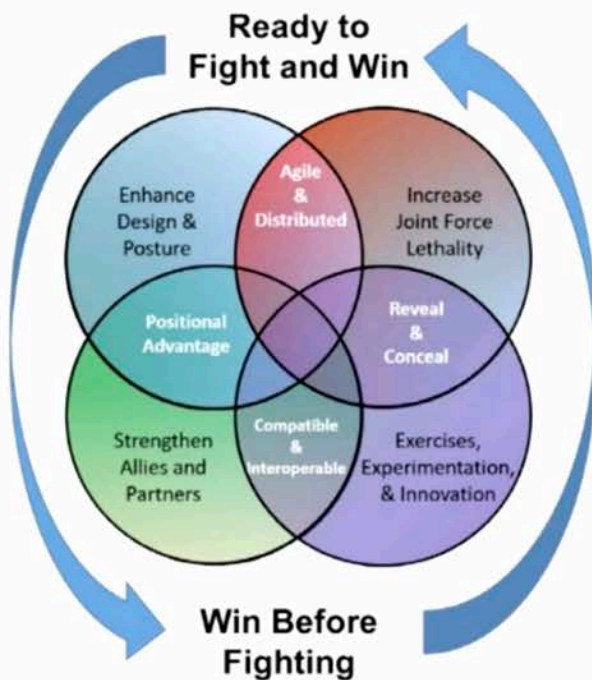

- 5) Relative peace, stability, and growing prosperity

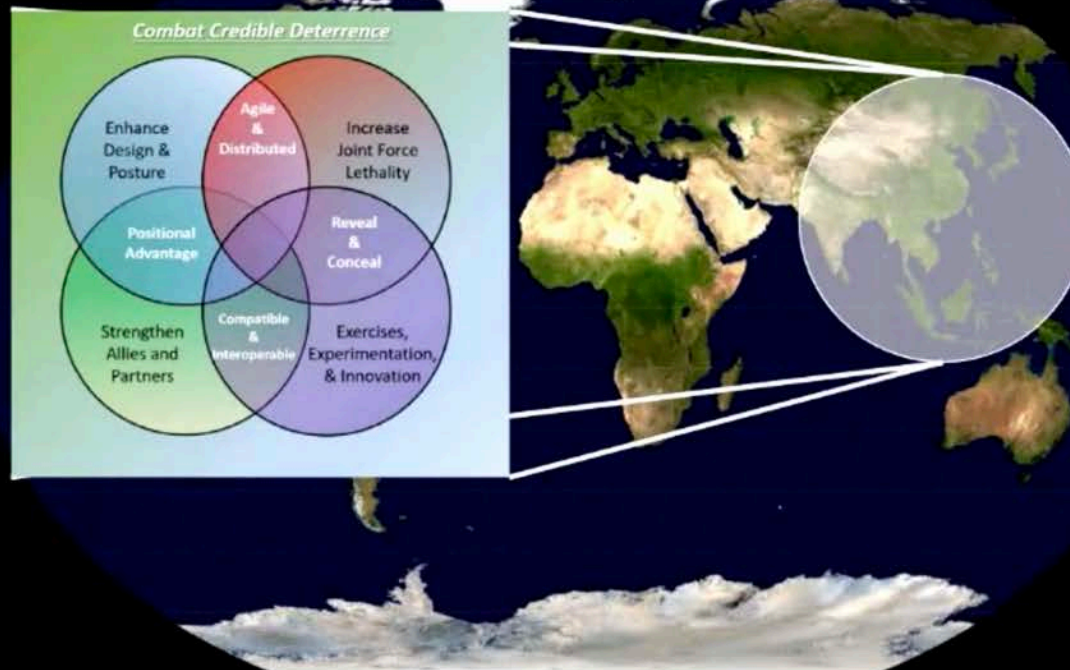
